## My requirements:

- You must select a topic and let me know your plans (on a notecard)
- Project must include a 2 page (double spaced, size 12 font) research paper on the topic of your choosing. Your goal is to learn MORE about something we covered not tell me what I've already taught you!
- You must also include a **visual** of your choice. Some examples are: travel brochure, poster, game board, mobile, diorama, timeline, electronic presentation... BE CREATIVE!
- We will work on this project in class so come prepared to work. I will not provide any materials beyond what is already in our classroom

(ie: scissors, crayons, social studies books, etc.)

- We will not have computers available every day Computers will be available Monday, Tuesday & Thursday. The majority of research and typing should be done at home or during free time/recess at school.
- All research must be cited. Don't worry about APA/MLA formatting—an example would be:

"Who Was Christopher Columbus" By: Bonnie Bader.

\* All projects will be due on the due date. If they are not received on time, you run the risk of the grade book closing and earning NO credit for this final project.
